Two members of the Senate who are members of a committee hearing bills on nonpublic special education programs appointed by the President of the Senate; and

Two members of the House of Delegates who are members of a committee hearing bills on nonpublic special education programs appointed by the Speaker of the House; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Commission shall make a report of its findings and recommendations to the Governor Legislative Policy Committee and the General Assembly no later than January 1, 1980.

RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Maryland Historical Trust is requested to move rapidly towards reconstruction and take all steps necessary to have the Samuel A. Mudd Home restored as an historical site; and be it further
