In accordance with Article II, Section 17 of the Maryland Constitution, I have today vetoed Senate Bill 802.

This bill permits the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore by ordinance to fix the rate of interest on overdue City property taxes.

House Bill 1774, which was passed by the General Assembly and signed by me on June 1, 1982, accomplishes the same purpose. Therefore, it is not necessary for me to sign Senate Bill 802.

requiring an annual report; and specifying the funding
for the Council.
