{iii}--THE-NOTICE-SHALL-INCLUDE--THE--DATE, TIME---AND---PLACE--OF--THE--HEARING,--THE--PURPOSE--OF--THE EXPENDITURE,--THE-ANTICIPATED-AMOUNT-OF-FUNDS-TO-BE-EXPENDED, AND-IF-THE-EXPENDITURE-IS-MADE,--THE-REMAINING-BALANCE-IN-THE RESERVE-FUND-FOR-PERMANENT-PUBLIC-IMPROVEMENTS.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1982.

Dear Mr. President:

In accordance with Article II, Section 17 of the Maryland Constitution, I have today vetoed Senate Bill 1091.

This bill authorizes the Carroll County Commissioners to establish a fund for self insurance of county property and provides that the County Commissioners may set certain limits on the fund.

House Bill 1914, which was passed by the General Assembly and signed by me on June 1, 1982, accomplishes the same purpose. Therefore, it is not necessary for me to sign Senate Bill 1091.
