Also,

Leave was granted the committee on Claims to introduce a bill to pay A. Lingan Jarrett his salary as late Comptroller.

On motion of Mr. Chew,

Leave was granted the committee on the Judiciary to introduce an Act for the relief of Fielder Bowie and William N. Burch, sureties on the official bond of William A. Quynn, former collector of Prince George's county.

On motion of Mr. Markey,

Leave was granted the committee on the Judiciary to report a bill to change the name of Fannie Parker, of Baltimore city, to Fannie Parker Roelkey.

On motion of Mr. Robinson,

Leave was granted the committee on Inspections to report a bill to add a new section to Article ninety-six of the Code of Public General Laws entitled, weights and measures ;

Also, leave was granted the Anne Arundel county delegation to report a bill authorizing the County Commissioners of Anne Arundel county, to allow the Sheriff of said county additional compensation for boarding prisoners in the jail of said county from the 1st of April, 1864.

On motion of Mr. Malone,

Leave was granted the committee on the Judiciary to report a bill to regulate the per diem and mileage of witnesses, to the several courts in this State.

Mr. Willis submitted the following resolutions :

WHEREAS, To save the slave holding States from being made the slaughter house of America, with the loss of their blood and treasure to the country, and to make a full and final settlement of the secession and negro question, out of which so many evils to our country have grown.

*Therefore be it resolved,*

1st. That the Legislature of Maryland recommend the President and Congress of the United States to abolish human slavery throughout the land, and that the general Government pay all loyal owners for their emancipated slaves, as the most wise, just and judicious plan the human mind can devise *publica fides servanda est*, (public faith must be maintained.)
