Said bill was then returned to the Senate.

Mr. Smith, of Allegany, from the Judiciary committee, reported favorably Senate bill entitled, an Act to refuse to make valid certain bequests in the last will and testament of John Smenner, late of Allegany county, Md.;

Which was read the second time.

Mr. Soper, from the committee on Ways and Means, asked to be relieved from the consideration of a petition of John Moorehead and Wm. Welsh, and that the petition be referred to the committee on Claims;

Which was granted.

Mr. Soper, from the committee on Ways and Means, reported favorably a bill entitled, an Act to repeal so much of section two Article 81 of the Code of Public General Laws, relating to revenue and taxes, as relates to taxes on mortgages, and to add an additional section thereto;

Which was read the first time.

Mr. Jones, from the committee on Corporations, reported favorably a bill entitled, an Act to incorporate the Canton Marine Railway Company of Baltimore;

Which was read the first time.

Mr. Malone, from a Select committee, reported favorably a bill entitled, an Act to amend an Act passed at January session 1862, entitled, an Act to authorize the vestry of St. Peter's Protestant Episcopal Church, in the town of Salisbury, in Somerset county, to take and hold a lot of land devised by the last will and testament of William Henry Dulaney, by adding a preamble and additional section;

Which was read the first time.

Mr. Fawcett, from a Select committee, reported favorably an Act prohibiting the sale of spirituous or fermented liquors in the several counties of this State on the day of elections;

Which was read the first time.

The Senate bill entitled, an Act to incorporate the Union Orphan Asylum of Baltimore,
