On motion of Mr. Smith, of Allegany,

The consideration of the bill entitled, "an Act prohibiting the sale of spirituous or fermented liquors in the several counties of the State on the day of elections" was resumed.

Mr. Silver submitted the following amendment:

Section 2nd. And no person shall bring within two miles, any liquor to be given away, or drink any on said day, unless prescribed by a physician;

Which was rejected.

The bill having been read a second time was ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

The bill entitled, an Act to Incorporate the Canton Marine Railway company of Baltimore,

Was taken up for consideration upon its second reading.

Mr. Jones submitted the following amendment:

Section 4, line 4, strike out Legislature and insert General Assembly;

Decided in the affirmative.

The bill having been read a second time was ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

The Senate bill entitled, an Act to refuse to make valid certain bequests in the last will and testament of John Smenner, late of Allegany county, deceased.
