

tion among the several Counties and the City of Baltimore, the amount allowed on the levy for insolvencies and abatements, and shall transmit a statement of the same to the State Superintendent; and to each County and the City of Baltimore a statement of the amount apportioned to it.

## TITLE V.—UNIVERSITY OF MARYLAND.

### CHAPTER I.

SECTION 1. The corporate powers of the University of Maryland are hereby enlarged so as to embrace in addition to the “Faculty of Arts and Sciences” situate in the city of Baltimore, the three Colleges receiving an annual State donation, to wit, St. John’s College, Annapolis; Washington College, Chestertown; the Agricultural College in Prince George’s County. Corporate powers enlarged.

SEC. 2. The University shall be governed by a Board of Regents consisting of the several Faculties as now constituted, together with those of St. John’s College, Annapolis; Washington College, Chestertown; and the Agricultural College, Prince George’s County. Board of Regents

SEC. 3. There shall be a University Council, consisting of the State Board of Education, the Presidents of the Faculties of the affiliated Colleges and of the Medical and Law Schools, and four citizens, appointed by the Governor, eminent for their learning and zeal in the cause of Public Instruction. The Council shall advise with reference to the course of study and grade of attainment required for graduation; but in all cases the examinations for degrees shall be conducted by the Faculties of the respective Colleges. University Council.

SEC. 4. All degrees shall be conferred by the Provost of the University of Maryland on the Degrees.
