

fourth day of July, in the City of Baltimore. The Candidates for the Bachelors' degree shall be presented by the President of the College in which they have graduated.

Course of Study. SEC. 5. The Council of the University shall appoint the course of study to be pursued in the High Schools, adapting the Classical and Scientific Course specially for admission to the University Colleges.

Scientific degrees They may also confer degrees upon young men of Scientific attainments, Graduates of the Colleges, although they may not have completed the Course of Latin and Greek Classics. Such degree shall be styled, Bachelor of Science.

To make By-Laws.

SEC. 6. The Council of the University shall make such By-Laws for their government as they may, from time to time, deem expedient.

TITLE VI.—BENEVOLENT, REMEDIAL AND REFORMATORY INSTITU- TIONS.

CHAPTER I.

**Schools, &c.—an
Asylum.**

SECTION 1. That the duty of the State to provide for the amelioration of that portion of her citizens who have been denied the full use of their mental or physical powers, and of those who by ignorance have been debased into criminals may be recognized; it is declared, that this System of Public Instruction is designed to embrace, an Asylum for the Blind, an Asylum for the Deaf and Dumb, a School for Idiotic and Feeble-Minded Youth; and other Benevolent and Remedial Institutions. Also Schools for the Instruction of the inmates of the Penitentiary, County Jails and County Alms-Houses, for which it is
