Said bill was then returned to the Senate.

The Secretary of the Senate delivered the following bill:

An Act to encourage volunteering to fill quotas under the call of the President of the United States for three hundred thousand men, dated December, 1864, and for other purposes.

Endorsed "amendments Nos. 1, 3, 4, 5, 7 and 8 concurred in, and amendments Nos. 2 and 6 non-concurred in."
