Answer. Yes.

Question. More than once?

Answer. Yes.

Question. Will you state as briefly as you remember the

circumstances attending the raising of that flag?

Answer. At the time of the first flag raising the ladies had charge of it, and as it was going up the flag got caught half way. Mr. Harvey Carman, George Yellott, Ady and Grason were present when that flag was caught, there was some cheering and waving of hats over there at Ady's porch. Mr. Thompson went forward and immediately refixed the flag and hoisted it, after that the ladies cheered.

Question. These persons that made this demonstration

where were they standing when the flag was caught?

Answer. On Ady's porch.

Question. Where was Mr. Grason at that time?

Answer. There amongst the crowd.

Question. Did any of those men at any time during the

raising give any cheers for the flag?

Answer. Yes: they did; they hurraed and waved their hats when it was caught.

The examination in chief of this witness was here concluded.

Cross-examination.

Question. Where were you standing when the flag was caught?

Answer. About ten yards from the pole?

Question. How far from Ady's?

Answer. About thirty or forty yards, I reckon.

Question. Were you standing by yourself or in a crowd?

Answer. I was in a crowd.

Question. Was it outside or in the centre of the crowd?

Answer. Outside, leaning against the railing. Question. Between the crowd and Ady's? Answer. Not directly between the crowd?

Question. Was your face towards the flag-pole?

Answer. At one time it was, and at another time it was in the other direction.

Question. There was no difficulty in you hearing what occurred at Ady's, was there?

Answer. No.

Question. You did hear what occurred at Ady's clearly and distinctly, did you?

Answer. Yes: I did,

Question. You do not know whether it was Saturday or Sunday that they started for Baltimore city, do you?

Answer. It was either Saturday or Sunday; it was Sunday afternoon they came and ground their sabres.
