The bill entitled, an Act to repeal certain sections of the twenty-ninth Article of the Code of Public General Laws relating to special judges, and enacting other sections in lieu thereof,

Was taken up for consideration upon its second reading.

Mr. Agnew submitted the following amendment:

Amend 80th section by striking out all after the the word take, in line 105, to the word which, in line 107, and insert "before the Clerk of the Court, the oath prescribed in the 7th section, 1st Article of the Constitution ;"

Which was adopted ;

Mr. Stone moved that the further consideration of the bill be postponed informally ;

Which was decided in the negative.

The said bill having been read the second time was ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.
