Amend section 9, strike out all after the word "it," in line 5.

Mr. Rinehart, submitted the following amendment to the amendment:

Amend section 9, by striking out all after the word "that" and insert: If any dog shall be detected in killing or injuring sheep, and proof thereof shall be made by the oath of the owner of said sheep, or any other person being a competent witness, before a justice of the peace, the owner of said dog, upon complaint to him made and information of such proof, shall proceed forthwith to kill said dog, and on his refusal or neglect to do so, the owner of said sheep may kill such dog afterwards found running at large, or may apply to a constable who upon production of the aforesaid affadavit, shall proceed to the house of the owner of said dog, and kill said dog there or wherever else found;

Which was adopted.

The question then recurring upon the amendment as amended;

Mr. Miller, of Anne Arundel demanded the yeas and nays.
