

Mr. King submitted the following amendment:

Line 11th strike out the words "fruit or;"

Which was rejected.

The bill having been read the second time was ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

The Secretary of the Senate delivered the resolutions requesting our Senators and Representatives in Congress to use their utmost endeavors to prevent the passage of a law imposing a tax on leaf tobacco.
