Ordered, That the order passed February 1st, 1865, instructing the committee on Claims to adjust the mileage of members, in accordance with the present existing law upon the subject, be and the same is hereby rescinded, and the following order adopted in lieu thereof.

Ordered, That the committee on Claims be instructed to adjust the mileage of members, in accordance with the law of 1849, chapter 178, provided, the per diem and mileage together of each member of this General Assembly shall not exceed the sum of four hundred dollars, as provided by the Constitution ;
