

Leave was granted the committee on the Judiciary to introduce a bill to amend and re-enact section six of Article five of the Code of Public General Laws, and section twenty of Article forty-eight of said Code, relating to appeals in cases of insolvency;

Also, leave was granted the same committee to introduce a bill to make valid the bond of Orville Horwitz, filed in a certain cause in the Circuit Court for Baltimore county;

Also, leave was granted the Anne Arundel county delegation to introduce a bill to amend and re-enact sections 55 and 58 of Article 2d of the Code of Public Local Laws, relating to the sale of spirituous liquors to minors and persons of color in the city of Annapolis.

On motion of Mr. Fawcett,

Leave was granted the committee on Ways and Means to report a bill for the relief of sureties on the official bond of Phillip J. Counel, late sheriff of Montgomery county.

On motion of Mr. Pennington,

Leave was granted the Cecil county delegation to introduce a bill supplementary to the Act of 1864, chapter 353, entitled, an Act to incorporate the President and Commissioners of the town of Cecilton.

On motion of Mr. Smith, of Allegany,

Leave was granted the committee on Corporations, to report a bill to incorporate the Youghagany Petroleum Coal, Iron and Lumber company of Allegany county.

On motion of Mr. Brown,

Leave was granted the committee on Ways and Means to introduce a bill authorizing the payment of bounties under the Act of 1864, chapter 15, to sundry veterans from Allegany county, who enlisted into the service of the United States in January, 1864, as part of the quota of this State.

On motion of Mr. Markey,

Leave was granted the committee on the Judiciary, to report a bill to add new sections to the 24th Article of the Code of Public General Laws entitled, "conveyancing."

Mr. Poteet from the committee on Claims, reported favorably a bill entitled, an Act appropriating a sum of money to compensate the bailiffs of Baltimore city, for the collection of taxes in arrears in said city and the State of Maryland, for the years 1862, 1863 and 1864;

Which was read the first time.
