

On motion of Mr. Chew,

Ordered, That the committee on the Judiciary inquire into the expediency of reporting a bill, imposing a tax on all unmarried male citizens between the age of twenty-five and fifty years, the proceeds of which shall be applied to the amelioration of the condition of the widows and orphans of those who have fallen in defence of their country, in her struggle against treason and traitors ;

Mr. Miller, of Anne Arundel, moved that it be laid upon the table ;

Which was rejected.
