Mr. Hoffman, from a Select committee, reported favorably on the bill entitled, an Act empowering Thomas Watts, John M. Wheeler and George Cullison, to sell the Cullison Meeting House property in the fifth election district of Baltimore county, and use the proceeds for the erection of a church near Wheeler's School House ;

Which was read the first time.

The bill entitled, an Act amendatory of the Act of 1864, chapter 289, entitled, an Act to Incorporate the Franklin and Powhatan Passenger Railway company,

Was taken up for consideration upon its second reading.

Mr. Lee, of Baltimore city, submitted the following amendment :

"Strike out the second section,"

Decided in the negative.

Mr. Pilkington submitted the following amendment :

"Strike out the third section,"

Decided in the affirmative.

The said bill having been read the second time was ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

The bill entitled, an Act to authorize the consolidation of the Bankers and Brokers Telegraph company with companies of the same name in the States of Pennsylvania, New Jersey and New York,

Was taken up for consideration upon its second reading,

Pending which the hour of one o'clock having arrived, the House proceeded to the election of a State Treasurer.
