The ballot box was delivered to Messrs. Poteet and Miller, of Anne Arundel, who, having conveyed it to the Senate Chamber, returned and made the following

REPORT:

The Tellers, Messrs. Poteet and Miller, of Anne Arundel, on the part of the House of Delegates conjointly with Messrs. Ohr, and Earle of the Senate, to count the ballots for State Treasurer, report that there were ninety-five ballots cast of which Robert Fowler received eighty eight votes and there were seven blank ballots.

Whereupon it was announced that Robert Fowler having received a majority of the votes cast, is duly elected Treasurer of the State of Maryland.

The House resumed the consideration of the pending bill.

Mr. Miller, of Anne Arundel, submitted the following amendment:

Amend by inserting the following at the end of the first section;

And, provided also, that the company so consolidated, shall have the privileges and be subject to all the provisions, regulations and restrictions contained in the 26th Article of the Code of Public General Laws of this State;

Decided in the affirmative.

Mr. Rinehart submitted the following amendment:

After the word "passage" in 2nd line, section 3, and the Legislature hereby reserves the right to alter, amend or repeal this Act when it thinks proper;

Decided in the negative,
