Compensation.

SECT. 153.—Officers composing courts martial, and witnesses attending before them, and all officers and men detailed on provost duty, shall receive the following sums for each day of attendance:

The president and members of such court martial four dollars.

The judge advocate of the same, five dollars; which shall be in full compensation, also, for all services of preparing papers before, and completing the record after any trial.

The provost marshal, three dollars.

And each witness attending on such court, one dollar.

Fees for subpænas and service of them, shall be the same as in civil cases.

No allowance shall be made for pay or rations for a military guard, unless the order for such guard is approved by the commander-in-chief, and in such case every commissioned and non-commissioned officer and private of such guard, shall receive for each day's duty compensation as hereinafter provided by sections 190 and 200.

SECT. 154.—The pay rolls of courts martial and of guards shall be made out and transmitted as hereafter provided in sections 201 and 203.

PROCEEDINGS IN CASES OF RECUSANT DRAFTED PERSONS, AND OF PERSONS EXPELLED THE NATIONAL GUARD FOR DISLOYALTY.

Trial.

SECT. 155.—Any officer or private of the National Guard may be tried by general court martial, on charges of disloyalty.

SECT. 156.—In such cases, the charge shall be verified by the affidavit of the complainant, distinctly specifying the actions or words upon which such charge is founded. The enlistment oath of the party, or his oath of office, shall be taken as prima facie evidence of his loyalty, and the burden of proof to sustain the charge shall be upon the complainant.

SECT. 157.—Upon the acquittal of the party so charged, the court may, in its discretion, sentence the complainant to pay the costs of the prosecution, and if, in their opinion, the charges were frivolous, malicious and without probable cause, may further sentence the said complainant to pay a fine not exceeding five hundred dollars.

SECT. 158.—Upon the conviction of any party so tried upon charges of disloyalty, the sentence shall be expulsion from the National Guard.
