The Honorable, the Speaker, by request, announced the following decisions:

1st. *Withdrawal of Motions.*—A motion, when regularly made, seconded and proposed from the Chair, is then in possession of the House, and cannot be withdrawn by the mover, or directly disposed of in any manner, but by a vote; hence if the mover of a question wishes to withdraw, modify it, or to substitute a different one in its place, he must obtain the leave of the House for that purpose; which leave can only be had, if objection is made, by a motion and question in the usual mode of proceeding.

2d. *Can a Motion for the Withdrawal of a question prevail the yeas and nays having been ordered?*—A motion for the withdrawal of a question is in order, the yeas and nays having been ordered. If by a vote of the House the question is withdrawn, and afterward renewed, the yeas and nays must be again ordered.
