Also, the bill entitled, An act to amend article 43 of the Code of Public General Laws, relating to habeas corpus;

Endorsed "passed by yeas and nays, with proposed amendment," viz:

Amend the 1st section, by adding the following:

"But nothing herein shall prevent the issuing of a writ of habeas corpus at the instance of a person arrested on a charge of any offence which is bailable by law, in order that he may be discharged on bail, in the usual course of law;"
