Mr. White, from a select committee, reported favorably a bill entitled, An act to add new sections to article 30, of the Code of Public General Laws, entitled, Crimes and Punishments, to provide for the punishment of persons who may sell articles of merchandise being transported on highways, railroads, canals, without the consent of the owner thereof;

Which was read the first time.

Mr. Magruder, from a select committee, reported favorably a bill entitled, An act to amend 292, of article 93, of the Code of Public General Laws, entitled, Testamentary Law, providing that in all cases of administration, the widow shall have the right to take and apply to her own use, a certain amount of the personal property;

Which was read the first time, and referred to the committee on the Judiciary.

Also, a bill entitled, An act to amend sections 53 and 56, of article 66, of the Code of Public General Laws, entitled, Negroes, relating to vagrant free negroes;

Also, a bill entitled, An act to allow Alexander Baker, former collector of State and county taxes for the third collection district of Calvert county, further time to complete his collections;

Which were read the first time.

Also, a bill entitled, An act amendatory of the act passed at December session, 1846, chapter 234, entitled, A supplement to an act concerning the Annapolis and Elkridge Railroad Company, passed at December session 1841, chapter 168;

Which was read the first time, and referred to the committee on Ways and Means.

Mr. Bowie, from a select committee, reported favorably a bill entitled, An act for the relief of the sureties on the official bonds of William A. Quynn, late collector for the third collection district of Prince George's county;
