On motion of Mr. Christopher,

The leave to report a bill entitled, An act concerning foreign insurance companies, was transferred from the committee on Ways and Means to a select committee composed of Messrs. Christopher, Donaldson and White.

Mr. Donaldson, from the committee on Ways and Means, reported unfavorably upon the petition of William A. Stewart, administrator of W. O. Eichelberger, to have refunded certain taxes;
