The proceedings of yesterday were read.

Mr. Carroll presented the petition of Thomas J. Jones and forty-four others, citizens of Dorchester county, asking the repeal of the law forbidding the emancipation of slaves;

Which was read and referred to the committee on Colored Population.

Mr. Dove presented the petition of sundry citizens of Harford and Baltimore counties, praying for a law authorising and enjoining upon the commissioners of said counties, to lay out and locate a road at the proper costs to each county;

Which was read and referred to the Harford and Baltimore county delegations.

Mr. Davis, of Montgomery, presented the petition of A. R. Wadsworth and a number of other citizens in the neighborhood of Emory Chapel, Montgomery county, for the passage of a law prohibiting the sale of intoxicating drinks within four miles of said chapel;

Which was read and referred to the Montgomery county delegation.

Mr. Mathews presented the papers relating to the compensation of Librarian, for making catalogue, &c.;

Which were read and referred to the committee on Claims.

The Secretary of the Senate delivered the following message:
