

On motion of Mr. Chamberlain,

The rules were suspended,

And the following was submitted as a substitute for the bill entitled, An act to repeal the 79, 80, 81, 82, 83, 84, 85, 86th sections, of the 35th article, of the Code of Public General Laws, relating to elections, and to substitute in lieu thereof the following:

Strike out all after the enacting clause and insert:

“That sections 79, 80, 81, 82, 83 and 84, of article 35, of the Code of Public General Laws, entitled, Elections, and relating to the election of Representatives in Congress from this State, be amended and re-enacted, so as to read as follows:

“79. This State shall be divided into five districts, for the choice of five Representatives in the Congress of the United States, which shall be numbered from one to five; and each of which shall be entitled to chose one Representative.

“80. The First Congressional District shall be composed of Worcester, Somerset, Dorchester, Talbot, Caroline, Queen Anne’s and Kent counties.

“81. The Second Congressional District shall be composed of Cecil, Harford, Baltimore and Carroll counties.

“82. The Third Congressional District shall be composed of the city of Baltimore.

“83. The Fourth Congressional District shall be composed of Frederick, Washington and Allegany counties.

“84. The Fifth Congressional District shall be composed of St. Mary’s, Charles, Calvert, Prince George’s, Anne Arundel, Howard and Montgomery counties.

“Sec. 2. And be it enacted, That sections 85 and 86 of said article be and the same are hereby repealed.”
