The proceedings of yesterday were read and approved.

Mr. Willis presented the petition of Willis Corkran and twenty-five other citizens of Caroline and Dorchester counties, praying a change in the location of school districts, on the line of said counties;

Which was read and referred to the Caroline and Dorchester county delegations.

Mr. Kerr presented the petition of T. H. W. Lambdin and one hundred and sixty-five others, citizens of Talbot county, protesting against the passage of a law, authorising the dredging for oysters in the waters of this State;

Which was read.

Mr. Lewis presented the petition of J. Mitchell and others, respecting fences in Harford county;

Which was read and referred to the Harford county delegation.

Mr. Reese presented the petition of one hundred merchants and others of Baltimore, praying an extension of the stay law;

Which was read and referred to the select committee on the stay law.

Mr. Alexander called up the order of which he gave notice yesterday, (page 657,) and

The order was rejected.

On motion of Mr. Mathews,

Ordered, that the Clerk of this House, forthwith send to the Mayor of the city of Baltimore, a certified copy of the law, known as the Baltimore Police Bill, in order that the authorities of Baltimore, may have official knowledge of the passage of said law, and that the same may be used, by the Commissioners of Police, in the organization of the police force of said city.

On motion of Mr. Lewis,

Leave was granted the Harford county delegation to report a bill, to add new sections to article 12, of the Code of Public Local Laws for Harford county, relating to fences.

On motion of Mr. Purnell,

Leave was granted the Worcester county delegation to report a bill for the relief of Levin S. H. Smith, of Worcester county, and to authorise him to retain in this State, a certain negro slave, named Isaac.
