

(2) A REQUEST THAT THE COMMITTED PERSON BE PROHIBITED FROM HAVING ANY CONTACT WITH THE VICTIM OR VICTIM'S REPRESENTATIVE, AS A CONDITION OF RELEASE.

(F) TREATMENT OF INFORMATION BY HEALTH DEPARTMENT.

IF A VICTIM OR VICTIM'S REPRESENTATIVE SUBMITS INFORMATION TO THE HEALTH DEPARTMENT UNDER THIS SECTION, THE HEALTH DEPARTMENT SHALL:

(1) CONSIDER THE INFORMATION;

(2) MAINTAIN AT THE FACILITY THAT HAS CHARGE OF THE COMMITTED PERSON, SEPARATE FROM THE MEDICAL RECORD OF THE COMMITTED PERSON, THE WRITTEN STATEMENT OF THE VICTIM OR VICTIM'S REPRESENTATIVE; AND

(3) DELETE THE VICTIM'S OR THE VICTIM'S REPRESENTATIVE'S ADDRESS AND TELEPHONE NUMBER BEFORE ANY DOCUMENT IS EXAMINED BY THE COMMITTED PERSON OR THE COMMITTED PERSON'S REPRESENTATIVE.

(G) CONFIDENTIALITY.

THIS SECTION MAY NOT BE CONSTRUED TO AUTHORIZE THE RELEASE TO THE VICTIM OR VICTIM'S REPRESENTATIVE OF ANY MEDICAL, PSYCHOLOGICAL, OR PSYCHIATRIC INFORMATION ON A COMMITTED PERSON.

(H) NOTICE OF PERSON'S ABSENCE WITHOUT AUTHORIZATION.

THE FACILITY OF THE HEALTH DEPARTMENT THAT HAS CHARGE OF A PERSON UNDER § 3-111 OF THIS TITLE SHALL PROMPTLY NOTIFY THE STATE'S ATTORNEY AND A VICTIM OR A VICTIM'S REPRESENTATIVE WHO HAS REQUESTED NOTIFICATION UNDER THIS SECTION IF THE PERSON IS ABSENT WITHOUT AUTHORIZATION.

(I) IMMUNITY.

AN AGENT OR EMPLOYEE OF THE HEALTH DEPARTMENT WHO ACTS IN COMPLIANCE WITH THIS SECTION SHALL HAVE THE IMMUNITY FROM LIABILITY DESCRIBED UNDER § 5-522 OF THE COURTS ARTICLE.

REVISOR'S NOTE: This section is new language revised without substantive change from former HG § 12-122.

In subsection (a)(3) of this section, the defined term "victim's representative" is substituted for that part of the former definition of "victim" that included "a designated family member of a victim" to conform to the terminology used throughout this article.

In subsection (d)(5) of this section, the defined term "Office" is substituted for the former obsolete reference to an "administrative law judge" for accuracy.
