

(1) that the person has committed a crime listed in subsection (b) of this section; and

(2) that unless the person is arrested immediately, the person:

(i) may not be apprehended;

(ii) may cause physical injury or property damage to another; or

(iii) may tamper with, dispose of, or destroy evidence.

(b) The crimes referred to in subsection (a)(1) of this section are:

(8) the wearing, carrying, or transporting of a handgun under Article 27, § 36B of the Code; [and]

(9) carrying or wearing a concealed weapon under Article 27, § 36 of the Code; AND

(10) PROSTITUTION AND RELATED CRIMES UNDER ARTICLE 27, §§ 426 THROUGH 431 OF THE CODE.

(d) "Offender" means a person who is ordered by the court to register under this subtitle and who:

(1) has been convicted of violating child abduction or kidnapping statutes under Article 27, [§ 1,] § 2[, or] OR § 338 of the Code;

(6) has been convicted of violating ANY OF the prostitution [statute under Article 27, § 15 of the Code or any of the pandering] AND RELATED CRIMES statutes under Article 27, §§ 426 through [433] 431 of the Code if the intended prostitute OR VICTIM is under the age of 18 years;

(a) The Secretary shall establish and conduct an educational program on acquired immune deficiency syndrome (AIDS) for persons who plead guilty or nolo contendere to, or who are found guilty of, violating:

(1) [Article 27, § 15 of the Code (Bawdy Houses and Houses of Ill Fame; Prostitution, Etc.)] THE PROSTITUTION AND RELATED CRIMES SUBTITLE OF ARTICLE 27 OF THE CODE; or

(2) Any provision of the Maryland Controlled Dangerous Substances Act.

(b) The educational program established under subsection (a) of this section shall:

(1) Consist of at least 4 hours of instruction; and
