The provisions of this subtitle creating the School Health Pilot Program and relating to the regulation of this Program and any regulations promulgated under the Program are of no effect and may not be enforced after July 1, [1992] 1997.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an emergency measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health and safety, has been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three-fifths of all the members elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from the date it is enacted.

AN ACT concerning

**Office for Individuals with Disabilities and State Maryland Advisory Council for
Individuals with Disabilities**

FOR the purpose of changing the names of the Office for Handicapped Individuals and the State Advisory Council for Handicapped Individuals in a certain manner.

BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,

Article - State Government

Section 8-403(d)(8); and 9-1101, 9-1102, and 9-1106 to be under the amended subtitle "Subtitle 11. Services to Individuals with Disabilities"
