

SUBTITLE 2. ADMINISTRATION AND ENFORCEMENT.

9-201. DELEGATION.

THE COMMISSIONER MAY DELEGATE ANY POWER OR DUTY OF THE COMMISSIONER UNDER THIS TITLE.

REVISOR'S NOTE: This section is new language added to clarify the apparent intent of the General Assembly to allow delegation of responsibilities of the Commissioner. It is based on the references, in the first sentence of former Art. 56, § 168, the first and second sentences of § 168A, and the first sentence of § 169(a), to "his duly designated representative" and "his authorized representative".

The Business Regulation Article Review Committee notes, for consideration by the General Assembly, that the Committee was unable to discern any powers or duties of the Commissioner under this title that were not delegable.

9-202. DISPOSITION OF MONEY.

THE COMMISSIONER SHALL PAY ALL MONEY COLLECTED UNDER THIS TITLE INTO THE GENERAL FUND OF THE STATE.

REVISOR'S NOTE: This section is new language derived without substantive change from the thirteenth sentence of former Art. 56, § 163(a) and the seventh sentence of (b). It is revised in standard language to conform to similar provisions in other titles of this article and to other requirements of law. See Md. Constitution, Art. III, §§ 32 and 52 and Title 7 of the State Finance and Procurement Article.

9-203. MISCELLANEOUS POWERS.

(A) IN GENERAL.

TO PERFORM A DUTY OR EXERCISE A POWER UNDER THIS TITLE, THE COMMISSIONER MAY ADMINISTER OATHS, DEPOSE WITNESSES, AND CERTIFY TO OFFICIAL ACTS.

(B) SUBPOENAS.

TO PERFORM A DUTY OR EXERCISE A POWER UNDER THIS TITLE, THE COMMISSIONER MAY ISSUE SUBPOENAS FOR THE ATTENDANCE OF WITNESSES TO TESTIFY OR TO PRODUCE EVIDENCE.
