

3-101(e) and (f), respectively. Since the commonly understood meanings of "amusement ride" and "carnival" are basically as they have been defined in § 3-101(e) and (f), the defined terms are used in this section. No substantive change is intended.

The Business Regulation Article Review Committee also notes, for consideration by the General Assembly, that this section does not cover the purchase of a ticket to a fair, amusement park, or amusement attraction. The General Assembly may wish to consider broadening this provision.

SUBTITLE 2. ADMINISTRATION AND ENFORCEMENT.

3-201. RESPONSIBILITY OF COMMISSIONER.

(A) IN GENERAL.

THE COMMISSIONER SHALL ADMINISTER AND ENFORCE THIS TITLE.

(B) COST OF ADMINISTRATION AND ENFORCEMENT.

(1) THE PROPOSED BUDGET OF THE DIVISION OF LABOR AND INDUSTRY SHALL INCLUDE AN APPROPRIATION FROM THE GENERAL FUND OF THE STATE TO COVER THE COST OF ADMINISTERING AND ENFORCING THIS TITLE.

(2) THE WORKERS' COMPENSATION COMMISSION SHALL REIMBURSE THE GENERAL FUND OF THE STATE FOR THIS COST FROM MONEY THAT THE COMMISSION RECEIVES UNDER § 9-316 OF THE LABOR AND EMPLOYMENT ARTICLE.

REVISOR'S NOTE: This section is new language derived without substantive change from former Art. 89, §§ 68(a)(1) and 79.

In subsection (b)(1) of this section, the reference to "enforcing" this title is added to conform to subsection (a) of this section.

Also in subsection (b)(1) of this section, the reference to a "proposed budget" is substituted for the former reference to the "budget" in light of the prerogative of the Governor in preparation of the proposed budget. See Md. Constitution, Art. III, § 52. In any event, as enacted by the General Assembly, the State budget is later enacted law and would supersede the requirement of subsection (b)(1) of this section.
