

\$10, \$15, or \$20 per day to \$50 per day; (7) changes the hours during which Class D licensees (taverns) may sell beer, wine and liquor from 6 a.m. to 1 a.m. to 6 a.m. to 2 a.m.; and (8) permits Class D seven-day licensees (taverns) to sell beer, wine and liquor on Sundays from 1 p.m. to midnight.

Senate Bill 48, which was passed by the General Assembly and signed by me on May 12, 1998, accomplishes the same purpose. Therefore, it is not necessary for me to sign House Bill 853.

House Bill No. 853

AN ACT concerning

Caroline County - Alcoholic Beverages - Licenses

FOR the purpose of increasing by a certain amount the maximum percent of alcohol by volume allowed in light wines in Caroline County; creating a certain caterer's license; increasing the fees for certain licenses; establishing a 7-day Class D license; altering the sale hours allowed for holders of a certain Class D (taverns) license and allowing those holders to sell beer, wine and liquor on Sundays; increasing the number of times a certain special license may be granted during 1 year; and generally relating to alcoholic beverages in Caroline County.
