

State of Maryland, Caroline County Court; Whereas applications
 heretofore to me, on the nineteenth day of March in the year of our Lord
 one thousand eight hundred and twenty two, a Certain John Clements,
 by deed of Manumission duly executed acknowledged and recorded
 among the Land records of Caroline County, did among other Manumit
 and set free a certain ^(now calling herself Frances Ann Daniel) Negro Girl called Fanny, to be free from
 and after the first day of January Eighteen hundred and forty one;
 And the said negro woman named Frances Ann Daniel having
 made application to me for a Certificate of her freedom agreeably
 to the acts of Assembly in such Case made and provided, and
 Whereas also upon the Oath of Martin Norris of Caroline County
 aforesaid that the said negro girl Fanny (now calling herself
 Frances Ann Daniel) for whom this Certificate is made, is the
 same person mentioned in the said Manumission, I do therefore
 grant her said application and hereby Certify, that from her
 age as expressed in the said Manumission she was twenty
 nine years of age on the first day of January last past,
 five feet one inch high or thereabouts, of a dark Complexion,
 was born and raised in Caroline County, and has a scar on
 her right arm near the elbow joint that a small scar on her face
 near her left eye, and has no other notable marks or scars
 that I have observed.
