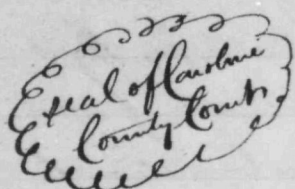

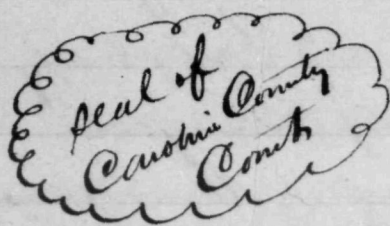

State of Maryland, Caroline County to wit: Whereas application hath been made to me by a negro man named George W. Stanford for a Certificate of his freedom agreeably to the acts of Assembly in such case made and provided, by which said acts free negroes and mulattoes are permitted to travel out of this State upon the obtaining of a Certificate of being free born, and Whereas also upon the affirmation of Henry Willson of Caroline County aforesaid that the said negro man named George W. Stanford for whom this Certificate is made was free born. I do therefore grant his said application and hereby Certify that from his own account he was twenty two years of age on the 13th day of November last past, five feet, eleven and one half inches high or thereabouts, of a dark chesnut complexion, was born and raised in Caroline County and has a large Scar on the inside of his left ankle, and has no other notable marks or scars that I have observed. —
