Memorandum the writ by Lewis Gale his attorney sued out his Writs
writ of Sequestr against the depts. the tenor whereof followeth in these
words vizt. Somerset p. Charles absolute Lord and proprietor

of the provinces of Maryland and Avalon Lord Baron of Baltimore &c. To the Sher. of Somerset County greeting
whereas a certain Benjamin Waite of Somerset County Quendo shad lately in our County Court of
Somerset there to wit the fifteenth day of march and. Dow one thousand seven hundred and twenty
five before the worshipful Samuel Hopkins and his associate, then our Justice of our said
Court
