The bill entitled, an act to incorporate the Book Company of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in the United States, was read the third time, passed and sent to the house of delegates.

Mr. Hilleary from the committee on revolutionary claims, to which was referred the resolution in favor of Elizabeth Ayres, widow of Thomas Ayres, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second, and by special order the third time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

On motion of Mr. Schley,

The bill entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act authorizing persons holding real estate in fee simple to construct wharves on any of the navigable waters of this State, passed at December session 1835, chapter 68, was taken up for consideration.

The amendment heretofore reported, was read and assented to.

The bill was then read the second and by special order the third time, and passed.

On motion of Mr. Schley,

The title of the said bill was amended as follows:

Strike out all after the word "act" and insert, "to authorize and empower persons owning real estate on any of the navigable waters of this State, to construct wharves thereon, passed at December session, 1835, chapter 168."

The bill was then returned to the house of delegates.
