

FRIDAY, January 27, 1837.

The Senate met. Present the same Senators as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The memorial of Bene S. Pigman, for compensation as counsel for the state in a certain case therein mentioned, referred yesterday to the consideration of, was sent to the house of delegates.

Mr. Hilleary submitted the following order,

Which was read and adopted.

Ordered, that the committee on judicial proceedings, be requested to examine the 21st section of the act to establish magistrates courts in the several counties of this state, and to report to the Senate whether any amendment is necessary, with a view to the relief of the duties of the chief justices of said courts.

The President announced the order of the day,—being the bill entitled, an act to regulate the right of voting by the stockholders in the several incorporated institutions in this state,

It was being read the second time, when

On motion of Mr. Schley,

It was re-committed to Messrs. Tidball, Jones and Bowie.

On motion of Mr. Jones,

Leave was granted to the committee on insolvency, to prepare and report a bill to be entitled, a further supplement to an act entitled, an act for the despatch of business in Baltimore county court.

The clerk of the House of Delegates delivered a resolution in favor of William B. Bond,

Which was read the first time and referred to the committee on finance.

Also, the following bills:

A bill entitled, an act to enable Theodorick Bland, to bring certain slaves into this state,

Which was read the first time and referred to the committee on colored population.

A bill entitled, an act to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road from some point on the National Turnpike Road west of Cumberland to intersect the North-western Turnpike Road of Virginia, at some point in Allegany county,
