Schley and Wright be appointed a committee to wait upon the House of Delegates and inform the speaker and members thereof that his excellency the Governor is now in the Senate Chamber, prepared to sign and seal the engrossed bill, No. 1, and that their attendance to witness the ceremony is respectfully requested. Messrs. Schley and Wright left the Senate Chamber and after a time returned and reported, that they had performed the duty assigned them.

Whereupon the speaker and members of the House of Delegates appeared in the Senate Chamber, when his excellency Governor Veazey signed and sealed the engrossed bill, No. 1, in conformity with the requirements of the constitution and laws.

The speaker and members of the House of Delegates retired.

His excellency Governor Veazey also retired.

The Senate adjourned until to-morrow morning, 10 o'clock.
