

TUESDAY, January 3d, 1837.

The Senate met. Present the same Senators as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

Mr. Schley submitted the following preamble and order,

Which were read and adopted:

Whereas, William Price, Esq. of Washington county, has made known to the Senate, his refusal to serve as Senator: it is thereupon ordered, that the Senate forthwith proceed to elect by ballot, and in the mode prescribed by the constitution and form of government, another person a resident of the Western Shore, a senator in his place for the residue of the term for which he was elected.

The Senate proceeded to the said election.

On motion of Mr. Schley,

Robert M. Tidball of Washington county, was put in nomination. The ballot box was prepared, and the ballots deposited therein, and on examination thereof, by the clerk, it was ascertained there had been 12 votes given, all of which were for Robert M. Tidball.

Whereupon, it was declared that Robert M. Tidball, Esq. is duly elected a senator for the Western Shore, to supply the vacancy occasioned by the resignation of Wm. Price, Esq.

On motion of Mr. Schley,

The following order was read and adopted:

Ordered, that the President of the Senate, be requested to address a letter to Robert M. Tidball of Washington county, and to forward the same to him by mail, informing him of his election as Senator and requesting his early attendance at the seat of government.

On motion of Mr. Purnell,

The following preamble and order were read and adopted.

Whereas, Thomas K. Carroll, Esq. of Somerset county, has made known to the Senate, his refusal to serve as Senator: It is thereupon ordered, that the Senate proceed forthwith to elect by ballot and in the mode prescribed by the constitution and form of government, another person a resident of the Eastern Shore, a Senator in his place, for the residue of the term for which he was elected.

The Senate proceeded to the said election.
