By the House of Delegates,

January 2, 1837.

Gentlemen of the Senate,

His Excellency, Thomas W. Veazey, of Cecil county, having been re-elected Governor of this State, we propose with your concurrence, the appointment of a joint committee of the two houses, to wait on him and inform him of his re-election, and request his attendance in the Senate Chamber, to qualify according to the Constitution and Form of Government of this State. We have appointed Messrs. Hemsley and Perry, to join such gentlemen as may be appointed by your honorable body.
