It was read the second, and by special order the third time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Goldsborough, from the committee on colored population, to which was referred the resolution in favor of Ann Millard, widow of Joshua Millard, deceased, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second, and by special order the third time, assented to, and returned to the house of delegates.

The following order was taken up for consideration:

Ordered, That the Treasurer of the Western Shore, be requested to inform the Senate if it may be done without injury to the State, at what premium in his judgment the stock created by the act of 1836, chapter 395, could be sold in the United States or Europe, under the present provisions of that act, and what effect the creation of a sinking fund of half a million of dollars, pledged to the redemption of that stock would have upon the sale of said stock.
