

WEDNESDAY, January 18, 1837.

The Senate met. Present the same Senators as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

On motion of Mr. Schley,

Leave was granted to Messrs. Schley, Brown and Jones, to prepare and report a bill to be entitled, an act to authorise and empower Sarah Murray, widow and administratrix of John Murray, late of Baltimore county, deceased, to execute certain conveyances as therein mentioned.

On motion of Mr. Tidball,

Leave was granted to Messrs. Tidball, Jones and Bowie, to prepare and report a bill to be entitled, an act to regulate the right of voting by the stockholders in the several incorporated institutions in this state.

The President announced the order of the day,—being the bill entitled, an act to confirm an act entitled, an act for the division of Baltimore and Frederick counties, and for erecting a new one by the name of Carroll, and to alter and change the constitution of this State so far as may be necessary to effect the same, passed at December session 1835, chapter 256.

It was read the second time.

Mr. Schley moved that the said bill be read the third time by special order,

The question was put and determined in the negative.

Mr. Brown presented a petition from sundry citizens of Baltimore county, praying that the bill to confirm the law of last session, to erect Carroll county, may be rejected,

Which was read and ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Schley from the committee to which the leave was granted, reported a bill entitled, an act to authorise and empower Sarah Murray, widow and administratrix of John Murray, late of Baltimore county deceased, to execute certain conveyances as therein mentioned,

Which was read the first and by special order, the second time, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.
