

FRIDAY, January 20, 1837.

The Senate met. Present the same Senators as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The bill entitled, an act to authorise McClintock Young of Washington city, to bring into this state his slave William, passed yesterday by the Senate, was returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Ricaud submitted the following message,
Which was read and adopted.

By the Senate,

January 20, 1837.

Gentlemen of the House of Delegates:

Your message of the 4th inst, proposing the appointment of a joint committee to "inquire into the practicability, probable cost and expediency of warming the Senate Chamber, the hall of the House of Delegates and the offices attached to them respectively, the Council Chamber, and all other apartments of the State House, occupied and used for public purposes, or any one or more of them, by means of heated air, or by any other means calculated to promote the comfort of the members and officers of government" has been received, and we concur therein. We have appointed on the part of the Senate, Messrs. Ricaud, Schley and Goldsborough, to join the gentlemen named by your honorable body.
