

1835, chapter 68, reported that the committee had had said bill under consideration and were of opinion it ought to pass with the following amendment,

Which was read, and

On motion of Mr. Brown,

The bill and amendment were ordered to lie on the table.

After the word "Maryland," strike out the residue of the section, and insert:

"That the provisions of an act entitled, "an act to authorise and empower persons owning real estate on any of the navigable waters of this state to construct wharves thereon," passed at December session 1835, chapter 168, be and the same are hereby extended to all persons owning property situated in the town of Havre de Grace, in Harford county, by an estate therein for ninety-nine years, yet unexpired and renewable forever, provided that nothing herein contained shall be construed to authorise any such owners or their assigns to interfere in any manner by the erection and construction of any wharf or wharves with the vested rights of any incorporated company, or with the rights of any of the adjoining landholders."

The Senate adjourned until to-morrow morning ten o'clock.

The Senate met. Present the same Senators as on yesterday the proceedings of yesterday were read.

Mr. Schley from the committee to which the leave was granted, reported a bill entitled, an act to authorise the confirmation of the return of the commissioners in a certain case of proceedings under the act to direct descents in Frederick county,

Which was read the first and by special order the second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

Read the third time by special order, passed and sent to the house of delegates.
