Also, the bill entitled, an act to lay off a public Landing at the farm called "Retirement," near Leonard's Town, St. Mary's county,

Also, the bill entitled, an act to authorise Samuel McBride to bring into this State a slave for a term of years,

Severally endorsed, 'will not pass.'

The house then resumed the consideration of the unfinished order of yesterday, being the bill reported by Mr. Ford, chairman of the committee on the constitution, entitled, an act to amend the constitution and form of government of the State of Maryland.
