

States be, and they are hereby instructed to vote for such a modification and reduction of the tariff of duties as shall bring the revenue of the general government to a par with its actual wants, and thus relieve the people from the unnecessary taxation under which they now labor.

Resolved, That his excellency the Governor transmit to each of our Senators and Representatives in the Congress of the United States a copy of the foregoing preamble and resolutions.
