Mr. Rentch presented a petition of sundry citizens of Washington county, counter to the petition of the Trustees of the Methodist Episcopal Church of Clear Spring, in said county,

Which was read and referred to the committee already appointed on that subject.

Mr. Kershner presented a petition of four hundred and eighty-seven citizens of Washington county, praying that an act may pass so as to allow the practice of the Botanical or Thompsonian system of medicine,

Which was read and referred to the committee already appointed on that subject.

Mr. Richardson presented a memorial of the Board of Trade of the city of Baltimore, praying for an additional appropriation to complete the Baltimore and Susquehannah Rail Road,

Which was read and referred to the committee on internal improvement,

Mr. Richardson also presented a memorial of numerous citizens of Baltimore city, praying the repeal of the monopoly act in favor of the Medical Faculty,

Which was read and referred to the committee already appointed on that subject.

Mr. Alexander, seconded by two other members that voted in the majority, moved to reconsider the vote of the house upon said memorial, for the purpose of amending the endorsement on said memorial,

On the question being put, will the house reconsider their vote,

It was resolved in the affirmative.
