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MONDAY, February 13th, 1837.

And the bill entitled, an act to authorise Samuel Jordan, former collector of taxes in the sixth collection district of Baltimore county, now Carroll county, to complete his collections;

Were sent to the senate.

Mr. Carpinter presented a petition of Martha Turner, formerly of Charles county, praying a special act allowing her the controul and guardianship of her children;

Which was read, and referred to the committee on grievances and courts of justice.

The Speaker laid before the house reports from the clerks of Charles and Caroline county courts;

Also, a report from the register of wills for Caroline county, in obedience to the order of the House of Delegates of the 26th ultimo;

Which were severally read and referred to the committee on grievances and courts of justice.

The Speaker also laid before the house a report of the Trustees of Washington Academy, in Somerset county;

Which was read and referred to the committee on education.

The Speaker also laid before the house a petition of Benedict Reynolds, of Washington county, Pennsylvania, a soldier of the revolution, praying to be placed on the pension roll;
