The bill, entitled, an act to authorise the laying out and opening a road in Allegany county, therein mentioned;

Also, the bill, entitled, an act for the establishment of the Orphans' court of Carroll county;—And

The message adopted by the house on yesterday, in relation to the bill, entitled, an act to regulate the manner of taking testimony in cases of equity;
