

And, Mr. Rentch presented a memorial of sundry citizens of Washington county, praying the repeal of the act establishing the medical faculty, and the passage of a law authorising the practice of the botanical system in this State,

Which were severally read and referred to the committee already appointed on that subject.

Mr. Palmer presented a petition of the Directors of the Commercial Bank of Millington, on behalf of the Stockholders thereof, praying the passage of a law for the purposes therein mentioned,

Which was read, and referred to the committee on ways and means.

Mr. Henderson presented four petitions, signed by three hundred and two citizens of Cecil county, praying the extension of the Eastern Shore Rail-road through said county to the Pennsylvania line,

Which was read and referred to the committee on internal improvement,

And, Mr. Smith presented a petition of sundry citizens of the counties of Washington and Allegany, praying for the passage of an act to change the divisional line of said counties, so as to make Sideling Hill the line,

Which was read and referred to the committee on Grievances and courts of justice.

On motion of Mr. Kershner,

Ordered, that he have leave to withdraw from the files of the house, the petition and papers of Elizabeth Fouke and Henry Fouke.

Mr. Townsend, of Talbot, obtained leave to bring in a bill, to be entitled, an act authorising the Commissioners of the Tax for Talbot county, to levy on the assessable property of said county, a sum of money for the repairs of the Court-house of said county,

Ordered, that Messrs. Townsend, of Talbot, Martin and Kerr, report the same.

Mr. Handy submitted the following resolution,

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, that the Librarian be, and he is hereby authorised and required to furnish one copy of "Harris' Entries," if it can be procured, and if not, one copy of "Evans' Harris," for the use of Worcester county Court,

Which was read the first and by a special order the second time, assented to, and sent to the senate.
